

FAQ's

1. If I register for the fair, am I guaranteed an interview?

No, school divisions will select candidates to interview based on their known and anticipated needs. Not everyone is guaranteed an interview.

2. What should I bring?

You should bring copies of your resume for each school system for which you are interested and have applied. You may choose to bring other supporting documentation such as transcripts, copies of your license, licensure test scores, and letters of reference but these are not required. Some school divisions may choose not to collect these items or to collect resumes only from those candidates they select for interviews.

3. How should I dress?

As this is an interview for a professional position, you should dress appropriately.

4. How long are the interviews?

Interviews will last no more than 20 minutes.

5. Can I interview with more than one school division?

Yes, you could potentially interview with all participating school divisions.

6. Can I interview with more than one administrator for the same school division?

Yes, it's possible. That would be at the discretion of the school division.

7. If I am unable to attend, can I send someone else?

No.

8. If I am unable to attend, is there another way to get an interview with the participating school divisions?

You are encouraged to apply online to each school division for which you hold an interest. It is up to the individual school divisions to schedule interviews with applicants as needed.

9. I live in an area that is a considerable distance away from the fair? Should I attend?

That is a personal choice. Interviews are not guaranteed but if you teach in a critical need area, you are more likely to be selected for an interview.

10. What areas are considered "critical needs?"

Secondary mathematics, foreign language, ESOL, middle school math, middle school science, speech language pathology, special education, tech ed, marketing, library/media, earth science, chemistry, physics, reading specialist, family and consumer science, and Agriculture education are commonly considered critical need areas but areas of critical need can vary among the participating school divisions. Also, because there is a teacher shortage in most endorsement areas, almost every area is considered a high need in many divisions.

12. Can I attend the fair if I don't yet have a teaching license?

Yes. You can attend if you will be eligible for a teaching license by August 2019.
